



City of Fort Lauderdale’s Transportation and Mobility Department has created a summary of neighbor requests, major current projects and neighborhood organizations initiatives that are actively addressed during the month. The report will be sent to the neighborhood organizations on a monthly basis to continue to provide updates, as needed.

Transportation Q-Alerts:

Transportation Q-Alerts are requests that pertain specifically to the safety and enhancement for traffic related issues. The City’s Q-Alert process allows neighbors to enter a request for consideration for new traffic calming, repairs and/or replacements for existing City property that may have created a safety hazard, or to initiate a preventative measure.

Neighborhood Association Initiatives: NE 53 Ct west of NE 15 Avenue

Speed Humps Upcoming Installation:

- The department has made a determination and speed humps will be installed along NE 53 Ct. A scheduled timeline for the installation will be shared soon.
 - NE 53 Ct west of NE 15 Ave
 - Volume = 196 VPD
 - Speed = 31 MPH
 - Referenced **Q-Alert 731468**
- As a form of enhancement, the City’s Road Crew painted a dashed yellow line down the street, as this would help mitigate some of the existing speeding issues along the segment. (**Q-Alert 1006063**)

Pending Speed/Volume Study for Speed Humps: (Speed humps are not warranted)

- NE 57 Ct West of NE 15 Ave
 - The department has received the speed and volume data from Broward County.
 - Neither speed nor volume criteria were met.
Speed= 30 Miles Per Hour
Volume= 139 Vehicles Per Day

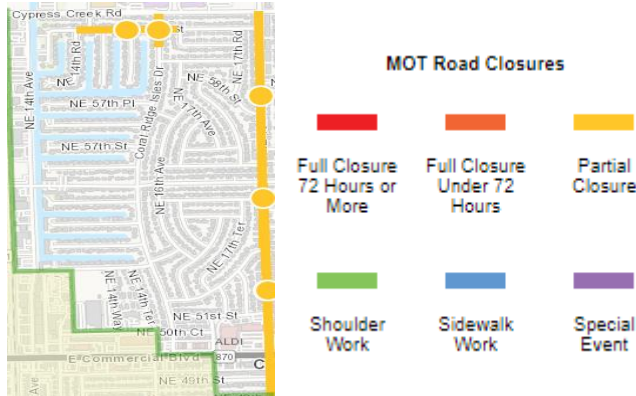
Pending Request:

- Neighbor has reported a downed Dead End sign at NE 57 St and NE 15 Ave.
 - A request was created and presented to Broward County Traffic Engineering to conduct a field review and further assist.
 - Staff performed a field review on January 19, 2023 and observed a leaning westbound ‘DEAD END’ sign at the subject location.
 - A work order was issued to straighten the signpost once the underground utilities locates request has cleared.
 - The work is anticipated to be completed within three to four weeks. Referenced **Q-Alert 1021054**

Project: Pike Electric and Viking Utility, on behalf of FPL, to replace and install new utility poles and transfer facilities.

Project Type: Private Contractor Closures

Vicinity: Intermittent partial lane closures on NE 60 ST between NE 14 Ln and NE 18 Ave.

Flagmen will be present to maintain two-way traffic and assist pedestrians around the work site.

Pedestrians will be detoured at NE 56 St and NE 62 St. Flagmen will also be present to assist

Upcoming Projects of Interest – updated bi-monthly

There are often projects that are within or adjacent to the neighborhood that will impact mobility for the neighborhood during construction as well as make improvements once completed. These may be a variety of planning and construction projects. They are both City as well as County and State projects and the Transportation Department monitors them to be able to share information as available.

NE 56th Street Project (NE 18th Ave to NE 20th Ave) – Broward County has begun installing new sidewalks along NE 56th St through their Penny Surtax Program as well as making improvements to drainage. The overall project scope includes the construction of six-foot sidewalks on both sides of the road, drainage Improvements including swale construction, milling and resurfacing of the existing asphalt surface, pavement markings and new signs. Construction began on May 9, 2022. Construction is anticipated to be completed by Spring 2023. NE 56th Street Project (Dixie Highway to NE 18th Ave) – Staff shared the request of residents in Coral Ridge Isles with Broward County to have sidewalks on both sides of NE 56th Street to complete the network between Dixie Highway and US1. **Broward County has programmed the project for funding. Design will begin in FY27.**

Commercial Boulevard RRR Project – The Florida Department of Transportation is developing a project to resurface Commercial Boulevard from Powerline Road to Tradewinds Ave in Lauderdale-by-the-Sea. As a part of the project City staff has requested that additional multimodal improvements be considered. One element that was requested was that a pedestrian crossing be considered between NE 19th Ave and NE 20th Avenue. FDOT completed a study and that location did not warrant the installation of a new signal. A public meeting is anticipated in July 2023, with construction planned for Fall 2024.

Since the August 2022 launch, the **Micro Mover powered by Circuit has made getting** around the city’s downtown, Las Olas and beach areas a breeze. The **FREE** service is a pilot project being evaluated during a six-month trial period to gauge its viability and overall mobility impact. With positive service delivery and performance since it began, the Micro Mover provides On-demand rides in the Downtown Area and a fixed-loop route in the Beach Service area. Learn more [here](#).
